

#### **Read Obadiah**

Obadiah reflects the bitterness that can come from family disputes and betrayal among relatives. The Edomites descended from Esau, the elder brother of Israel (Jacob; see Gen 25:19–34). They were complacent while Babylon destroyed Jerusalem in 587 BC. They were among many who harassed the returning Jewish exiles.

**Reflect:** Like Obadiah, I may have said in anger against a relative, "As you have done, it shall be done to you." Yet it is worth noting that Obadiah concludes, "...the kingdom shall be the LORD's." Can I accept that the LORD's kingship might be more inclusive than my narrow prayers?

**Pray:** Lord, teach me to acknowledge my hostilities and bitterness, and to turn them over to you. Grant that I may forgive and be open to reconciliation and the healing of broken relationships.

Act: Today I will recall a neglected, forgotten, or broken relationship. I will turn it over to God, and take a step toward reconciliation.

### Proud Edom Will Be Brought Low

1 The vision of Obadiah.

Thus says the Lord GOD concerning Edom: We have heard a report from the LORD,

- and a messenger has been sent among the nations:
- "Rise up! Let us rise against it for battle!"
- <sup>2</sup> I will surely make you least among the nations; you shall be utterly despised.
- <sup>3</sup> Your proud heart has deceived you, you that live in the clefts of the rock,<sup>a</sup> whose dwelling is in the heights. You say in your heart,
  - "Who will bring me down to the ground?"
- <sup>4</sup> Though you soar aloft like the eagle, though your nest is set among the stars, from there I will bring you down,

says the LORD.

#### Pillage and Slaughter Will Repay Edom's Cruelty

- <sup>5</sup> If thieves came to you, if plunderers by night —how you have been destroyed! would they not steal only what they wanted?
- If grape-gatherers came to you, would they not leave gleanings?
- 6 How Esau has been pillaged, his treasures searched out!
- 7 All your allies have deceived you, they have driven you to the border;

- your confederates have prevailed against you;
  - those who ate<sup>a</sup> your bread have set a trap for you—
- there is no understanding of it.
- 8 On that day, says the LORD, I will destroy the wise out of Edom, and understanding out of Mount Esau.
- Your warriors shall be shattered, O Teman, so that everyone from Mount
  - Esau will be cut off.

# Edom Mistreated His Brother

- <sup>10</sup> For the slaughter and violence done to your brother Jacob, shame shall cover you, and you shall be cut off forever.
- <sup>11</sup> On the day that you stood aside, on the day that strangers carried off his wealth,
  - and foreigners entered his gates and cast lots for Jerusalem, you too were like one of them.
- <sup>12</sup> But you should not have gloated<sup>b</sup> over<sup>c</sup> your brother on the day of his misfortune;
  - you should not have rejoiced over the people of Judah on the day of their ruin; you should not have boasted
  - on the day of distress.
- You should not have entered the gate of my people on the day of their calamity;
- you should not have joined in the gloating over Judah's<sup>d</sup> disaster on the day of his calamity;
  you should not have looted his goods on the day of his calamity.
- <sup>14</sup> You should not have stood at the crossings to cut off his fugitives;
  - you should not have handed over his survivors on the day of distress.

- <sup>15</sup> For the day of the LORD is near against all the nations.
  - As you have done, it shall be done to you;
    - your deeds shall return on your own head.
- <sup>16</sup> For as you have drunk on my holy mountain,
  - all the nations around you shall drink;
  - they shall drink and gulp down,<sup>e</sup> and shall be as though they had never been.

## Israel's Final Triumph

- <sup>17</sup> But on Mount Zion there shall be those that escape, and it shall be holy;
  - and the house of Jacob shall take possession of those who dispossessed them.
- <sup>18</sup> The house of Jacob shall be a fire, the house of Joseph a flame, and the house of Esau stubble;
  - they shall burn them and consume them,
    - and there shall be no survivor of the house of Esau;

for the LORD has spoken.

- <sup>19</sup> Those of the Negeb shall possess Mount Esau,
  - and those of the Shephelah the land of the Philistines;
  - they shall possess the land of Ephraim and the land of Samaria, and Benjamin shall possess Gilead.
- 20 The exiles of the Israelites who are in Halah<sup>f</sup>
  - shall possess<sup>g</sup> Phoenicia as far as Zarephath;
  - and the exiles of Jerusalem who are in Sepharad
  - shall possess the towns of the Negeb.
- <sup>21</sup> Those who have been saved<sup>h</sup> shall go up to Mount Zion to rule Mount Esau; and the kingdom shall be the LORD's.
